NEW All Roads Lead to Rome: Ancient Roman Art and Archaeology

Explore the world of ancient Rome, including architectural and engineering wonders like the Pantheon, the aqueducts, and the Colosseum; beautiful paintings of villa gardens; and marble sculptures of stunning realism. From the palaces of emperors to the lost cities of Vesuvius, from the glories of Rome as a great city to the mysterious frontier provinces of England and Egypt, this is grand tour through classical art and archaeology.

Discover the impetus and impacts that led, in short order, to Impressionism, Neo-Impressionism, Symbolism, Fauvism, Cubism, and Surrealism. The creative culmination brought new art stars to the fore while drenching the art world in a kaleidoscope of colors and patterns. Short videos enrich the conversation.

Chair Yoga

Students will enjoy an invigorating yoga practice with a slight modification – the chair is the 'ground.' Students will employ this everyday prop to take them through the range of motion for a full body workout that will include forward bends, backbends, and spinal twists for flexibility; standing and balancing poses to build stability and core strength; and breathing techniques for body awareness and stress reduction.

NEW Introduction to Hand Building and Beyond

Beginner to intermediate levels

In this exciting hand-building class, participants will learn all aspects of working with clay slabs, coils, and pinch pots. This class is great for beginners who are looking for a creative outlet and returning students who wish to advance to more complex techniques. Students will learn about surface decorations, how to add sprigs to forms to be able to customize and personalize. Both sculptural and functional forms will be addressed. There will be sessions for glazing/underglazing pieces.

Advanced Ceramics Studio

This studio course is geared to the student who is motivated to undertake ambitious individual work in clay and further their understanding of ceramic art. The goal is to provide the advanced student with the opportunity to grow and to produce desired but previously unattainable work. Student work will reflect well thought out and executed projects, including aesthetic decisions, an increased ability to handle material, and an increased proficiency with glazing techniques.

Working with Clay

NEW Terracotta, Wonders of Clay

Beginner to intermediate levels In this engaging course, students will explore the ancient art of terracotta, transforming raw clay into expressive, timeless forms. Through hands-on instruction, participants will learn essential techniques, such as preparing clay with the correct moisture and consistency, joining parts seamlessly, and mastering various texture methods. Students will create pieces using slab-building techniques, focusing on achieving the perfect balance of thickness and texture.

Throw Like a Pro

Intermediate to advanced levels This class provides an intensive immersion in wheel throwing. Students grow their skills and will learn shortcuts to successfully make pots on the wheel. Weekly demonstrations will cover basic forms, such as cups and bowls, and will move on to advanced forms such as tall vases and larger forms. Instruction on glazing techniques will round out the course, allowing students to finish pieces to take home and enjoy.

NEW Introduction to Ceramics: Basic Wheel Techniques

Students learn the basics of wheel throwing during this beginner class. They will experiment with surface decoration, including carving, and discuss various glaze applications. By the end of the session, students will be able to create both functional and decorative pieces, gaining the confidence to advance to more complex techniques. Key topics include studio safety, ceramics vocabulary, wheel-throwing steps, glazing, surface decoration, trimming, and pot anatomy.

By the end of the course, students will have developed a solid foundation in ceramics and completed a collection of unique creations to take home.

Students will develop a proficiency in figurative and portrait sculpture. Working in water-based clay and from a live model, students will create two figures and one portrait. The instructor will introduce principles of anatomy, gesture, and proportion as well as the intricacies of the hands, feet and facial features. Proportional calipers will be utilized to assist in developing accuracy.

All levels are welcome to join and students may bring in any broken glass, sea glass, and other glass they may have. Some glass in an array of beautiful colors will be provided for the dazzling and luminous creations.

In this class, students will learn how 19thcentury French artists such as Claude Monet broke away from European traditions. They explored light and color in addition to changing the subject matter from formal portraits to the working class.
